

A National Flag from the Qing Dynasty (1644-1912)




The Empire of China 1910



Years of National Humiliation 1842-1949

- Defeat in First Opium War (1839–1842) by the English;
- 'Unequal Treaties' (in particular Nanjing, Whampoa, Aigun and Shimonoseki);
- Defeat in the Second Opium War (1856–1860) & Sacking of the Old Summer Palace by English and French Forces;
 - Signed Treaty of Aigun (1858) and Treaty of Peking (1860) during the Second Opium War, ceding Outer Manchuria to Russia;
- Uprising by Muslim Hui and other Muslim Ethnic Groups in China's Shaanxi, Gansu and Ningxia provinces, as well as in Xinjiang (1862-1877);
 - Defeat in the Sino-French War (1884-1885), losing Dominion over VietNam & all Influence in Indochina Peninsula;
 - Defeat in First Sino-Japanese War (1894–1895);
 - Invasion of Eight-Nation Alliance to suppress the Boxer Rebellion (1899–1901), and Impose Reparations in Excess of the Government's Annual Tax Revenue;
 - English Expedition to Tibet (1903–1904);
 - Twenty-One Demands (1915) for Loan Advantage and Local Government Control by Japan;
 - Japanese Invasion of Manchuria (1931–1932);
 - Defeat in Second Sino-Japanese War (1937–1945).






